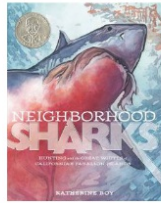
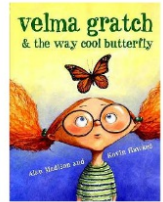
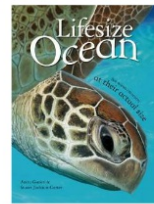
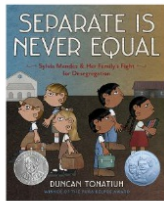
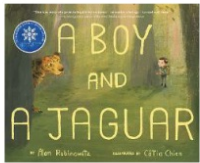




March and April activities in the

LIBRARY

Kindergarten - 3rd grade



We spent time looking at ocean animals, including Great White Sharks, and butterflies. We discussed how "separate" schools (by race) are NEVER equal. We also talked about how a boy who stutters managed to help create the world's first and only jaguar preserve - in Belize.



4th grade

The 4th graders explored the question of "Who created the Easter Island statues?" They looked at two theories - one by Dr. Thor Heyerdahl that claimed the inhabitants of Easter Island came from Peru, and another theory that claimed the inhabitants came from Polynesian islands. Students had to decide which theory they thought was correct.

5th grade

The 5th grade students spent March discussing the various taxes, including the Stamp Act, that were levied on the colonists. They also saw some videos talking about life at the time.

In April, we had a guest presenter (Karen Haas) who came and presented information about the Revolutionary War from both the Patriot and Loyalist points-of-view. We also started an examination of the events of the Boston Massacre. We looked at a reenactment of events and Eyewitness Accounts from the trial.

We continued our examination of the death of the Iceman in the Italian Alps, and watched a video that showed the further examinations of the mummy and tested out some of the theories of why he was there and potentially how he died.
