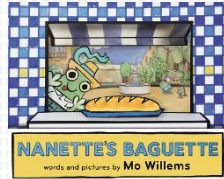
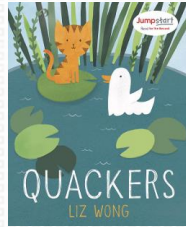


## Kindergarten - 3rd grade

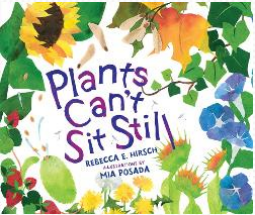
## 4th grade



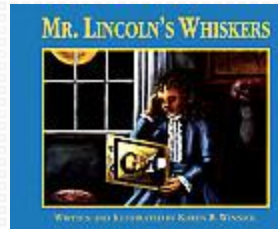
1st graders played "Soar's Escape" - an online Breakout game



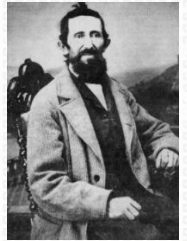
We did a lot of comparing and contrasting animals, learning the "et" sound, and did some science exploration.
